



International Medical Relief

For many living in the developing world, health and daily wellbeing is a perpetual challenge. In Cambodia, a staggering 45% of the country's population identified as malnourished and a staggering 75% in the Koh Rong archipelago. The Foundation has recognized the serious nature of this problem and has undertaken working with local communities to address the region's health concerns. Each year, the Song Saa Collective collaborates with International Medical Relief to spearhead an Archipelago-wide health mission bringing much needed health services to villagers who attend the mission's village clinics.

Project

The IMR mission visits six clinics across the islands of the Archipelago. IMR brings Internationally trained health professionals to run each clinic visit. These medical professionals will be supported by Cambodian translators who are also volunteers from the medical field, providing an invaluable learning opportunity for young medical professionals in Cambodia.
